Anyone that owns a MGF /TF could have this problem that is a slow to release / hard clutch pedal.

This is normally caused by the clutch shaft bushes in the bell housing seizing up due to lack of lubrication this can be quite easily remedied with an application of penetrating oil to the outside of the bush that is just below the slave cylinder, this can be quite difficult to access but with a little effort it be achieved and is a lot easier than the alternative of having to remove the gear box, that's one thing I can tell you.

So a little bit of preventive maintenance could save you a lot of heartbreaks and a lot of money.

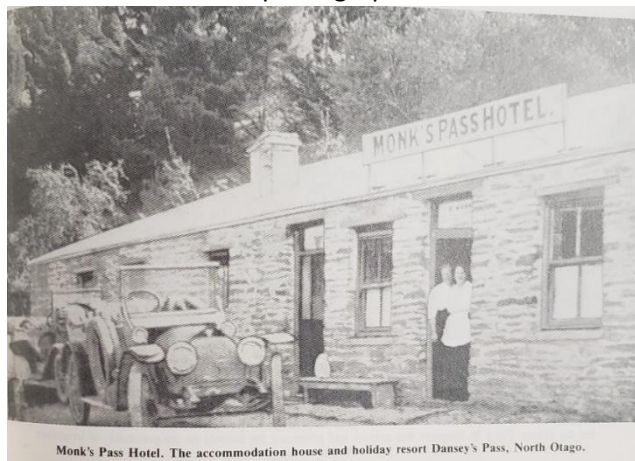

Although this item doesn't relate to our club, it does at least come from the UK club's archives. It's dated 15 July 1936 and it's John Thornley writing to the then Club Secretary, Mit Harris.

John, you will recall was probably the second most influential person in the history and success of the MG Car Company, after Cecil Kimber of course.

Here's John writing to Mit in London. (Presumably, the MG committee meetings were held in London at this time. Ed)

Dear Mit,

I'm sorry I haven't previously written to you to apologise for my absence from the Committee Meeting on Monday last and for not giving you any notice.

In actual fact I left Abingdon with the full intention of coming, got as far as Maidenhead and then **passed out in the bottom of the motor car.**

Presumably the next meeting will be somewhere around the tenth of August.

- One of a kind - Is this the rarest MG ever?



When the MG Car Company in Abingdon prepared itself in readiness for helping with the war effort in 1939, the decision was made to clear the factory ready for whatever Government contracts might come their way.

Being a relatively small factory, the MG facility had little spare capacity to store the hundreds of tons of valuable car parts. This was overcome by the acquisition of a dilapidated one-time clothing factory in the heart of Abingdon town centre. At that time East St Helens Street where the premises were located was extremely narrow and not suitable for large lorries.

The problem was solved when the MG team constructed a one-off “tractor” unit using whatever old MG car parts they could find lying around. Known as “Bitsy” it soon became a familiar sight winding its way through the narrow streets with its several trailers filled with everything from chassis frames and engines to the dismantled paint shop plant that had had pride of place in the middle of the assembly building.

As far as is known, “Bitsy” is long gone. Such a shame because it was a unique “MG” vehicle.

Final words (for a while) from the Club Archivist

Apart from catching up with our daughter, attending the opening event of the MG100 Centenary on 27 May 2023 at the British Motor Museum in Gaydon will be the highlight of “my” trip. Look out for my report on the event in due course. I won’t promise a date as there will be too much else going on over the two months we’re away.
