MG100

I was always hopeful that I might be able to attend the UK "MG100" celebration in 2023. The last time Marie and I had been in the UK was 2018, so by 2020, it was time to visit again. COVID, however put a spanner in the works for that trip. Then our planned 2022 trip was postponed as our daughter and her partner were joining us for Christmas in NZ that year. These delays however worked in my favour.

So, 2023 it was. And hey presto there I was online, booking my ticket to the opening of MG100 which was being held at the British Motor Museum at Gaydon on May 27th.

We based ourselves in nearby Stratford-upon-Avon which was less than hour away from Gaydon by bus.

The 27th dawned fine and warm as I let myself out of our Air B&B and no sooner had I done so when it started. There it was; an MGK3 driving along right in front of me. As you will be aware a K3 is one of the most rare and iconic MG racing cars of all time. Only about 30 plus a few prototypes were built and they are worth a King's ransom to buy.



As I arrived at Gaydon, it became clear that today's event was going to be well supported. To be honest I was rather overwhelmed by the sheer number of MGs on show and the large numbers of people attending.

It was wonderful to see so many early MGs, many of which I had only ever seen in photographs. The general standard of the cars was right up there with the best of them. I certainly wouldn't have wanted to be a concours judge trying to separate out the winner from a long lineup of outstanding examples.






Some if the custom-bodied MG cars were rather interesting, such as this example. It kind of looks like it has a "bustle"!

At the other end of the condition scale was this very used (and no doubt enjoyed!) T-type, with teddy bears and other detritus on show. I would love to know its history and I kind of hope it's not going to be restored one of these days. In this condition it's probably almost unique.



As you would expect, in the Museum itself, Old Number 1 was there... of course it's not actually number 1 as it was produced in 1925, three years after the first MGs were created.



... as was this well-known MGBGT with the "split" personality. Really interesting to examine.



And for Thunderbird fans, Lady P's car was on show:



This was one of my favourites, a "Cream cracker" trials MG.



While I didn't recognise any MG people from NZ among the throng, I'm sure there would have been some attending the event. No doubt a number of accounts will emerge over the coming weeks and months.

We often find today that the world is a very small place and MG100 was no exception. I shared a table over lunch with an English couple who owned a rather nice TC. Upon hearing that I was a New Zealander, they piped up to say that a cousin of theirs lived in, of all places, Dunedin!

MG Cyberster

On show in the Museum was a Cyberster prototype in camouflage paintwork. I'm sorry to say that taking photographs of the car wasn't permitted. The photo below has been taken from the Web instead. Up close it's an amazing looking car.



Overview from the book


A ground-breaking biography of M.G. founder Cecil Kimber.

M.G., the world's most-loved make of sports car, was created in the 1920s by Cecil Kimber - invariably known as Kim. Rising above disability, with his energy, enthusiasm, and vision, Kimber became a leading figure in the British motor industry. Initially placing sporty bodies on Morris' chassis, within a few years he had built M.G. into the leading European manufacturer of sports cars, with an impressive record of competition successes. He survived industrial upheaval only to fall victim to the venomous internal politics of M.G.'s parent company. Sacked from his high-profile job, he was preparing to bounce back when he lost his life in a needless accident. (Ed. In a train crash at Kings Cross Railway Station in London)

Respected businessman, wayward husband, fallible parent - Cecil Kimber was a man of surprising contrasts. Here for the first time is the colourful story of the man behind those famous initials.

I'm sure that other memories will come back to me in due course, but I'm so pleased I was able to attend the event. Thanks to Marie for allowing me to take a break for a day from our travels.
