Presidents Update

Let me introduce myself.

I am a retired farmer and live with my wife, Paddy Ann on the outskirts of Wanaka.

We have 4 children. Both boys are farming. Jon and his wife Birgit (from Austria) are dairy farming near Edendale, Southland milking 1200 cows over 2 farms, and Chris and his wife Jammie have a farm and agricultural contracting business at Becks, Central Otago. Jammie also works for Agiseeds Wrightson's as an agronomist. Our Eldest daughter Gemma along with her husband Mike, have 3 childcare centres at Lake Hayes. Our second daughter Holly has a hair dressing business on Stuart Street in Dunedin. We have 7 grandchildren.

Paddy was born in the States. Her father who was a Kiwi worked there after WW11 and married her mother who was from New York. They moved to Dunedin in 1954. Her father was responsible for introducing Insulfluff to NZ and they moved over NZ setting up factories. The first one was in Mosgiel.

I lived my first 47 years in South Canterbury having been born on a dairy farm near Winchester. This is where I acquired my first MGB, a 1965 model in 1973. This was the car I took Paddy in on our first date. She was teaching in Timaru. After having established an Agriculture Contracting business which I ran for 7 years, we bought this farm in 1991. Having sold it in 1998, we moved to Southland in 1999 and converted a sheep farm to dairy. As our son, Jon was running the dairy farm, we moved to Millers Flat in 2009 to be closer to our support farm we owned there. The Dairy farm was sold in 2015 and after this, we bought the MGB we own now. In 2018 we sold the support farm and bought our present property in 2019.

The present "B" has undergone a fair bit of restoration with a reconditioned motor (which I assembled myself) and a repaint (done by a local paint and panel shop). I entered it in two Targas, VCC section. I am pleased to say we completed both without incident apart from a flat tyre and a leaking oil pipe (loose fitting). The motor is still standard 1800cc. This due to it being afflicted with the old BMC problem of a porous block so had to be sleeved during reconditioning. Before participating in the 2nd Targa, I had the head worked by polishing the ports and putting 3 angles on valves and seats. This has enabled it to go up hills one gear higher. Also, fuel consumption has improved having once achieved 36mpg. On top of that we drove to and back the events which were both held in the North Island. We also own an XJ 40 Jaguar which I bought from my uncle and a Lotus Excel.

Finally, I would like to thank the past committee, most who are still committee members. I would also like to especially thank past president Bill, who had his challenges with both health and time during his time. The club seems to be in good heart, and I look forward to another enjoyable year.
